



# -Sight Words-







### SIGHT WORD GAMES

A little bit of practice each day goes a long way—consistency is the key. Practice kindergarten sight words daily if possible, but don't introduce too many at once. Younger children do best with four to eight sight words at a time. Here are some fun games to practice sight words!

#### **Recorded Words**

- 1. Download a free recording app on your phone. Record 10–12 sight words with 5–8 seconds between each word.
- 2. Lay 10–12 matching sight word flashcards on the table in random order.
- 3. Have the child play the recording, grabbing the right word when he or she hears it.

#### **Read and Cover**

- 1. Print the *Read and Cover* activity page from our free download packet.
- 2. Give the child red, orange, yellow, green, and blue blocks (or even colored candies).
- 3. Have them read aloud each sight word, then cover the word with the correct colored item, as found in the key.

#### Popcorn

- 1. Using yellow index cards or paper, write sight words and cut them in irregular shapes to look like popcorn.
- 2. Make a bowl of real popcorn.
- 3. Fill a small paper bag with the popcorn word cutouts and have the child say them, then place a piece of popcorn on each to eat when finished.

#### Swat It!

- 1. Lay the flashcards in a line.
- 2. Give the child a clean flyswatter.
- 3. Read a word and have the child swat that word.
- 4. Repeat for each of the words several times.

#### **Spilled Sight Words**

- 1. Put the sight word flashcards in a jar or box.
- 2. Have the child shake the words onto the
- table and read the words that land facing up. 3. Repeat several times.

#### **Craft Stick Puzzle Activity**

- 1. Gather some craft sticks.
- 2. Write the sight words on two sticks, so that half the word is on the top stick and the other half is below on the bottom stick.
- 3. Mix them up in a jar or bag or spread out on a table.
- 4. Have the child match the two parts of each sight word until all matches are complete.

#### Wipe It Off

- 1. Write the words on a whiteboard.
- 2. Say a word and have the child wipe it off. Or, have the child read any word on the board and wipe it off.
- 3. Repeat until all the words are wiped off.

#### Sight Word Parking Lot

- 1. Print the *Sight Word Parking Lot* sheet found in our free download packet.
- 2. Read off the sight words on the parking lot and have the child place a car on each word until the parking lot is full.

#### Simon Says with Sight Words

- 1. Lay the sight words out on the table.
- 2. Play Simon Says, but every action is to pick up a certain sight word.

#### Sights Words on the Steps

- 1. Lay out flashcards (or sight words written on sticky notes) on stairs in your home.
- 2. Have the child hop up the stairs, saying the word on each step before hopping to the next step.
